Carillon

About five years ago, I thought I should focus on relaxation and travel. That didn't last long when a dog with Russian breeding moved to Spring. His owner, Sandy Prince, brought him by, as she needed to find a groomer for him. I was dismayed to learn he was on a Limited AKC Registration, but that was rectified and his health tests were all clear, including cardiac. His pedigree also included some high achieving dogs from Australia, The Netherlands and Scandanavia. I graded his first litter and the pick bitch came back to me in a serendipitous way at 15 months. The frozen semen of Ch. Carillon Boulevardier had never been used, so I abandoned hopes of relaxation and used it to breed Suzy (Ch. Patchwork's Flying High). She was linebred on Ch. Carillon Chazzen De Hayyim, so it seemed like a good shot.

The frozen semen litter produced three titleholders for us, all Group Placing, with Ch. Carillon There's Your Trouble winning an Owner Handler Best in Show. Her class wins were stunning. Shlomo, Jr. (Carillon Caspian Cantor) finished with a Group Placement and was an outstanding partner to our breed's top Junior Handler, Nevaeh Stadtfeld. With time of the essence, we bred Carillon A Midsummer's Night Dream which produced 8 puppies in late 2023. The sire was her dam's littermate, Ch. Dreamcatcher's Obsidian Eclipse. We started showing Carillon Love To Love You Baby as soon as she was eligible and she defeated 3 Specials in breed for a 5-point Major and a Group 4 at 6 months and two weeks of age. She repeated the win at Houston Reliant for another 5-point Major and won another Group placement in October. "Elvie" (Carillon U R My Kinda Trouble) finished at Houston Reliant in July, still a Puppy 6-9 months! He's Group Placing as a 9-12 month puppy as well. And then came the amazing "Dreamer" (Carillon Dreams Come True At Thistledown). Campaigned briefly, she finished with two Terrier Group One's and a Three, still in the puppy 9-12 class. Of the seven survivors of this litter, none had any serious faults and we hope a few more will be shown.

Outcrossing can be very risky. We feel very fortunate that we were able to retain the character, temperament, good health, and look of our bloodline with a different pedigree. I'm still traveling but don't expect much relaxation in the coming years as we continue re-defining CARILLON!

DOGS ON THE RUN

The **BEDLINGTON'S** Start In **AGILITY!**

Agility started in England and came to the United States around 1987. Between 1995-1999, several Bedlington owners across the country decided to try something new with their dogs and tried agility. They were: Sue Latz from Ohio with "Willow" and "Wiggles"; Pat Hussey from Illinois with "Spanky"; Patti Bott from Southern California with "Calvin"; Jeri Bernard from Northern California with "Powder"; Randi Neil from Florida with "Dusty"; Debbie Miller from Arizona with "Andy" and Anacore Evans from Michigan with "Farnsie". These people were the pioneers of the Bedlington agility movement. Randi and Debbie went on to establish the on line agilbedli discussion group for Bedlington owners interested in agility. The group started with only 4 people and now has approximately 50 members strong.

"Powder" (Ch. Serendipity Uptown Girl) went on to become the 1st Bedlington to earn the AX, AXJ, MX and MXJ. She was the 1st Bedlington to compete at the Nationals in Denver 2001 and was the Top Bedlington in AKC Agility for 3 years in a row in 2001, 2002 and 2003. Continuing with the Serendipity success was Powder's litter mate "Hunter" (Ch. MACH8 Serendipity's Heartbreaker.) Melody Guiver brought Hunter to watch Powder compete in her first agility trial. Hunter was very much the cheerleader from the sidelines. I convinced Melody to start him in agility which she did. I felt it would be an excellent outlet for him and that he would be great. He was more than great! He went on to become the 1st MACH (Master Champion) Agility Bedlington 8 times! A Master Agility Dog 8 different times! He was the Top Bedlington in AKC Agility from 2004-2009. He retired in 2010. Since then, there have been many Bedlington MACH dogs.

Running an agility course with your best friend can be very exhilarating and rewarding when you both mesh. The dog begins to learn your body language and physical and verbal signals and cues. Many lessons can be learned from training and trialing your dogs. A very special bond is developed and a closeness and understanding evolves like no other. This bond has many ups and downs, which is also part of the journey. The Terrier breed is not the easiest to train for agility but the result is far more rewarding to me than any other.

The Bedlington Terrier was represented by 2 dogs for the 19th Annual Agility Invitational in Orlando. This event was held in December 2023. Paula VonGerichten ran her 2 dogs who ranked the number 1 and number 2 spots for the breed (pictures included). AKC picks the top 5 dogs in each breed to attend and you have to have MACH points earned out of the Masters Class to even qualify. Paula ran both "Rookie" and "Shilo" in the 16-inch regular division. Shilo earned the BTCA club medallion as the Top scoring Bedlington. Also invited but unable to attend was JoAnn Burtneiss with MACH6 Coventina's Moon-dance; Ride Of The Valkyries RN, FDC, MXS2, PAD, MJS2, PJD, OF, T2B, ME, CAX, BCAT, RATM, TKI and Patricia LeBlanc with Lady Penelope Pitstop UK, MX, MXB, MXJ, MJB, OF. Unfortunately, no other dogs qualified to make the 5th invitee.

The number of agility Bedlingtons is steadily dwindling. I believe there are only around 5 teams currently participating. This is not a happy moment for me because at one time there were over 45 teams competing. In my opinion, agility is the hardest discipline to train especially now as the courses have gotten so much harder. I have participated in 7 of the 8 companion/performance venues available to our dogs. The club sponsors a beautiful plaque for 8 of these awards for the Top Bedlington in each one. I have not competed in scent work. Here is a list of the difficulty in training for each of these... according to my experience with each one with the exception of Scent Work: Agility, Obedience, Rally, Earthdog, Barn Hunt, Coursing Ability Test, Fast Cat.

Banana Honey Biscuits

Try these yummy banana & honey dog biscuits! Bananas are rich in vitamins, potassium, and fiber while honey is a natural source of antioxidants and helps with allergies by boosting immunity.

Ingredients:

1 ripe banana, mashed
1 tablespoon honey
1 egg
2 cups whole wheat flour
½ cup rolled oats
¼ cup unsweetened applesauce (optional for extra moisture)

Items Needed:

Mixing bowl
Fork or potato masher (for the banana)
Measuring cups and spoons
Rolling pin
Cookie cutter
Baking sheet
Parchment paper



Instructions:

Preheat your oven to 325°F (165°C) and line a baking sheet with parchment paper. Mash the banana in a bowl until smooth. Add in the honey, egg, and applesauce (if using), and mix until well combined. Add the flour and oats, stirring until a dough forms. If it's too sticky, add a bit more flour. Roll out the dough on a lightly floured surface to about ¼-inch thickness. Cut the biscuits into shapes using your cookie cutter and place them on the prepared baking sheet. Bake for 20-25 minutes or until the biscuits are golden brown and firm to the touch. Cool completely before serving to your dog. Store any leftovers in an airtight container.

Substitutions & Additions:

Gluten-free version: Swap the whole wheat flour for oat flour or a gluten-free alternative.
Peanut butter boost: Add 1 tablespoon of unsalted peanut butter for an extra flavor punch (no xylitol or birch sugar!)
Coconut oil: Swap the applesauce for 1 tablespoon of coconut oil for additional healthy fats.

Tips:

Ripe bananas work best, as they're easier to mash and sweeter.
Don't overbake the biscuits—they should be firm but not rock hard.
Customize the shape: Use any cookie cutter you like! Heart-shaped, bone-shaped, or even classic rounds will do the trick.

Storage Instruction:

Once cooled, store the biscuits in an airtight container at room temperature for up to a week. For longer storage, keep them in the refrigerator for up to two weeks, or freeze them for up to three months. Your dog will love them frozen or thawed!

COLOR SENSE

We discussed again the decades long lament about color and texture in our Bedlington's coats in our recent AKC Gazette column. Two icons in the breed shared their knowledge of bringing on color with me. Ken Bounden told me that some exhibitors in Great Britain apply the disinfectant Benz-All to the body skin. The burn produces color. Joe Waterman told me that he damaged slicker brushes that injure the skin sufficiently to produce color. Don't try this at home! Laurie Friesen and I have had the experience of being approached by long time judges very familiar with our breed, commenting that most of the Bedlingtons they are currently judging have soft coats with few, if any, guard hairs. ***This is a wake up call!*** Ironically, Ann Neary commented about the same thing in the 1960's. Coloring our dogs is not only against AKC rules, it is clearly unethical. It is not just our breed. Some alteration practices in other breeds are downright cruel. To quote Ann Neary, *"Do let us show our Bedlingtons as the streamlined beauties that they are."* The objective of exhibition at AKC conformation events is to display our breeding stock, not our skill at grooming and concealing faults.

In a previous column, I referred to our Bedlingtons as living art forms, because of the color changes they experience throughout their lifetimes. It is one of the things that makes our breed so fascinating and fun to live with. Puppies are born solid black and solid dark brown, with bi-colors points lighter brown. The genetics are as complex as the dogs are interesting.

A breed standard cannot possibly address all the color nuances we observe in our dogs. All the factors we observe that influence our dogs' color are climate, sun exposure, age, diet, health, hormonal changes, and seasonal transitions. As noted, puppies start life in solid dark color. They begin to show signs of change at 4 to 5 weeks. By 6 months, the top knot is very light but the body color is darker with a mixture of color. Young adults can be very light, but darken up as they age. Bitches will typically darken when they approach pro estrus and stay dark well into their estrous cycle. It would not be practical to discuss all of these influences on color in a breed standard. Here is what we have to guide us in the approved breed standard:

The topknots of all adults should be lighter than the body color. Patches of darker hair from an injury are not objectionable, as these are only temporary. Darker body pigmentation of all colors is to be encouraged.

Much discussion is devoted to the directive that darker body pigmentation is to be encouraged. Does it mean hair and/or skin? Does it mean that a dog that isn't dark should be penalized? Should young adults that are very light be withheld from exhibition until their coats mature? I am not the first columnist and probably not the last to ponder these issues. I will paraphrase Anna Neary's GAZETTE column from the October, 1960 edition: *We in the U.S. overdo coat, and this column has drawn attention to it time and time again, the last being in April. Do let us show our Bedlingtons as the streamlined beauties that they are. I am intrigued with the references now going on regarding soft coat and almost light color of some specimens over here. Yet, there is something that bothers me. How come if we have lost pigmentation that*

our blues are still born black. Another strange phenomenon is having one excessively dark puppy and in the same litter, one excessively silver. Will the experts please explain!

We are still overdoing coat some 65 years later and lamenting less than ideal coats. A stroll through the grooming area with dogs being prepared for a specialty reveals the use of many substances, some clearly unethical, and certainly irritating to both humans and canines. A little white chalk in the legs and head that is blown out doesn't cross the line, but certainly could be irritating to the neighbors in the grooming area. Artfully colored and enhanced dogs put the honest exhibitors at a distinct disadvantage. Bedlingtons that have natural color and pigmentation are not often uniform and even, as Mother Nature doesn't have that artistic skill.

When an exhibitor applies color with black or gray chalk or human hair dye, the rules of the American Kennel Club are clearly violated. A shortened version of Chapter 11, Section 8 defines the violations as follows: "dogs with changed natural color or markings cannot compete or win awards. Judges must withhold awards and report any violations; both handlers and Judges could face disciplinary action." It is my opinion that enforcement of this rule can be equivocal, legally risky, and certainly would require a complete change in the culture of exhibition. I would certainly like to see a refinement of this rule to make it enforceable and make our sport more ethical. Our Bedlington breeders and exhibitors certainly need more guidance regarding color and pigmentation and should strive for ethical presentation.

And over the withers there is too much slack."

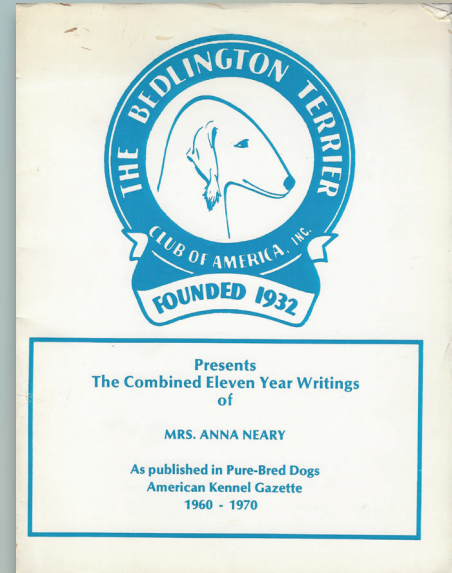
When voice I could muster, I told him with pride

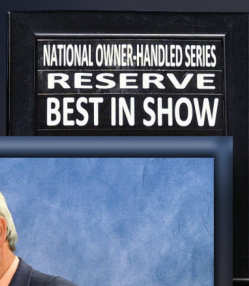

Tassel & Tale Telling

Tales of a Rat-Hunting Man is one of many books written by David Brian Plummer. The book is an autobiography by a rat-obsessed man, writer, teacher, and terrier breeder from a mining valley in Bridgend, Wales. From his introduction, *"Hard times beget hard men. Our valley was noted for two products: the Ffaldau Two Foot Nine Bituminous Coal, a much sought after and expensive fuel, and a particularly robust strain of rough-coated terrier that the local sportsman had created for fox digging, badger baiting and rat hunting. Story has it that some miners on a holiday in Somerset brought back a pair of Russell-type terriers, and the locals had crossed them with bull terriers, Sealyhams, Borders – in fact with everything that would fight to the death."* He goes on to describe the history of these hard-bitten terriers and the role they played in eliminating *"the most terrifying malady ever to hit Europe"* the Black Death or Bubonic plague. The plague was caused by the black rat (*rattus rattus*), which arriving by ship from the Far East around the 13th century. However other creatures like the house mouse and brown rat also spread the deadly disease. (Later to be determined to be caused by the flea that infested rats and other such vermin).

The Black Death brought rise to the legend of the Pied Piper of Hamelin. *"I am firmly convinced that such a person did exist, and the tale is not just another children's story"* writes Plummer. The tale of the piper in multicolored clothing who lures rats out of town - and to the river to drown - by playing his magical pipe turns macabre when he is not given his fee. Plummer is also convinced that dogs, particularly early terriers, helped to limit the spread of the rat carrying plague. *"They fought the dogs and killed the cats"* as mentioned in the tale proves his point. Dogs were instrumental in controlling the rat population and bubonic plague. It is interesting to note that cats were more susceptible to the plague than dogs and therefore the rats *"killed the cats"*.

In Chapter 5, *Ratting Dogs*, Plummer writes, *"Basic advice to anyone wanting to get a rat-killing dog: forget about fancy breeds, get a terrier. Many books state that terriers are natural rat killers; well, 'natural' is a debatable word. The terrier has been around since the year dot, and was bred to drive out foxes and bay badgers rather than kill rats. Most terriers are a far cry from the 'dolloed up' Crufts winners. They were originally low-bred curs who haunted the farms, living rough in barn and sty and justifying their meagre keep by killing such troublesome predators as stoats, weasels, polecats and their like, so the rat, coming in as a twelve-ounce catchweight opponent in the 1720s, did not prove too much trouble."* Chapter 3, *The Hunting of the Rat*, *"Some of the finest ratting terriers I have ever seen came from my home valley. The Sealyham blood in them gave them strength of jaw, the Bedlington blood endowed them with incredible agility, and the bull terrier blood – the real old fighting blood – gave them that little 'extra something' that made them impervious to pain."*

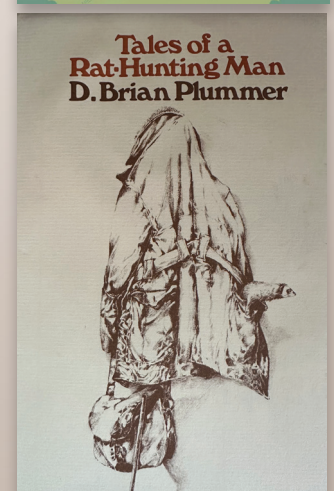
*Hamelin Town's in Brunswick,

Plummer mentions the Bedlington Terrier in other parts of his book, *"Many people (and I am not one) believe that otterhound blood was used in the creation of the Border, the Dandie Dinmont and Bedlington Terrier"* and again when guessing whether or not the Lakeland Terrier shared a common ancestry with the Bedlington. Both are now known to be true. *"I have seen some crackling Bedlingtons slay rats with great skill"* but Plummer prefers to hunt rats with either the Border, Lakeland, or hard strain of Jack Russell terriers as written in his unconventional book about rats. We won't hold this against him.

NOTICE: BYLAW REVISIONS

To All BTCA Members In Good Standing:

The following proposed Bylaws revisions have been made by the Board of Directors (revisions are highlighted):

(c) Single Membership. Open to all persons 18 years of age and older who has been an Associate Single Member for 3 consecutive years. Single Members shall enjoy all privileges of the Club, including the right to vote, hold office, and sponsor new members. Single Memberships are approved by a 2/3 vote of the Board.

(d) Household Membership. Open to two persons 18 years of age and older who reside at the same address and have been an Associate Household Members for 3 consecutive years. Both persons enjoy all privileges of the Club including the right to vote, hold office, and sponsor new members. Household Memberships are approved by a 2/3 vote of the Board.

(f) Foreign Membership. Open to all persons 18 years of age and older living outside of the United States. Foreign members cannot vote or hold office, but can sponsor new members. Foreign Memberships are approved by a 2/3 vote of the Board.

(h) Honorary Membership. Open to all persons 18 years of age or older, who have made significant contributions to the sport, breed or the Club; Honorary members pay no dues and are not eligible to vote, hold office, or sponsor new members. Honorary Memberships will be approved by 2/3 vote of the Board.

ARTICLE III. SECTION 5. Termination of Officer or Board of Director

Termination of an Officer or Board of Director must be done with cause (neglect of duty or misconduct).

A motion to remove the member must be made and seconded, followed by a discussion, and finally, a vote, requiring a two-thirds majority to pass. Removal must first require a formal disciplinary process to determine cause where the Board Member facing removal has a right to present their case before the vote.

Legacy Breeder Project

The Bedlington Terrier Club of America will launch its Legacy Breeder Project in the next few months. The Legacy Breeder Project recognizes our longtime breeders and their depth of knowledge in the breed and Club. Each Legacy Breeder will meet with an appointed Board Member for a video taped interview. We hope the interviews can be recorded in person, but will rely on a Zoom Meeting as an alternative option. Zoom Meetings are recorded and can be downloaded for editing. Each Board Member will conduct the interview with prepared set of questions for consistency. Our Legacy Breeders will be provided the set of questions well in advance. The purpose of the video recording is to preserve the memory of each Legacy Breeder, their wisdom in the breed, reflections of the past, visions for the future, etc. There is so much our future generations can learn from our Legacy Breeders! The Legacy Breeder videos will be shared on our BTCA You.Tube site for everyone to watch.
